December 2013

Anti-Social Behaviour

We are pleased to report that December has been a relatively quiet month, with few cases of Anti Social Behaviour.

Following a call to the Local Policing Team we assisted PCSO Slaughter in a search for three illegal off road bikes in the kings barn area. Unfortunately we did not see the bikes after an hour of searching kings barn lane and surrounding areas. We continued to patrol the area in the coming days and did not receive any further reports.

Following reports last month of anti social driving in the health centre car park, we have not had any further incidences reported. There have however been a few suspect vehicles reported to us which have been logged and we are monitoring.

We had a few calls from residents regarding a cold caller in Tanyard Lane. We located the individual in Charlton Street and checked his credentials and took his details.

Following a report from a resident in shooting field, we engaged and moved on a group of 5 youths, who were causing noise nuisance in Cuthmans Way. The group are known to us and we have spoken to some of the parents of the individuals involved.

A resident reported the theft of two curbstones in Hollands Road, we spoke to the individual and advised to report this to the police obtain a crime number.

Community

We attended the Christmas fair and late night shopping. There were no cases of anti social behaviour reported to us.

A meeting was held with ourselves and Emma Edwards, the community youth worker. We will be supporting the new youth club which starts in January at the Cuthman Centre.

It was reported last month that we had linked up with Steyning Health Centre in order to increase our vulnerable persons list. We had a meeting with one of the managers at the health centre and were advised of some data protection issues regarding personal information being disclosed.

We also carried out a property marking session with PCSO Slaughter in the Steyning Centre. This was directed at Steyning allotment holders.
