RECOMMENDED TIPS FOR USE OF SALT/GRIT

- **BEST USED BEFORE SNOW AND ICE FORMS**
- **CLEAR SNOW/ICE FIRST**
- **USE VERY SMALL AMOUNTS**
- **4 TABLESPOONS PER SQUARE METRE**
- **BEST TO SPRINKLE OR FLICK FROM A SHOVEL**
- **DO NOT PUT ON TOP OF SNOW – WASTED EFFORT!!**
- **HELP OTHERS IF YOU CAN**

The Steyning Parish Council has supplied the bins and grit for use by and for the benefit of the community. Any individual using the grit will be acting on their own initiative and this action will be at their own risk. It is recommended that the following equipment is used when spreading the salt; a high visibility vest/jacket, warm gloves, sturdy non slip waterproof footwear, warm clothing, a snow shovel and a fully charged mobile phone. If you are working alone, always contact someone when starting and finishing.
