Steyping Council Meeting **September / October 2013**

Crime Statistics for Steyping.

When comparing Steyping to other Parishes in the south Horsham district, Steyping has seen the biggest drop in crime with a reduction from the previous year of 28%. Burglaries and criminal damage have also reduced drastically when compared to the previous year.

0003 - 22/09/13 Burglary - Bowmans Close, Steyping.

The burglary took place between the 20:00 and 00:00 on Saturday the 21st September. Entry was gained through a smashed rear patio door, Jewellery and cash were stolen.

1064 - 01/10/13 Burglary - Horsham Road, Steyping.

The burglary took place around 15:15 on the 01st of October, during the break in a Jewellery box was stolen from the property.

0472 - 02/10/13 Burglary - Mill Road, Steyping.

On Wednesday the 2nd October, a farm along Mill Road was broken into around 02:00.

0301 - 04/10/13 Attempted burglary - Kings Barn Lane, Steyping.

There was a break in to a farm on Kings Barn Lane, nothing was stolen.

0920 - 06/10/13 Suspicious Vehicles Mouse Lane, Steyping.

Three vehicles were reported acting suspiciously along Mouse Lane, details were taken and words of advice given.

0882 - 10/10/13 Vehicle damage Tanyard Lane Steyping.

A vehicle was damaged during the evening of the 9th October, the vehicle was parked in the Tanyard Lane car park.

1508 - 11/10/13 Vehicle damage High Street, Steyping.

A vehicle was damaged during the afternoon on the 11th October, the vehicle was parked in the car park along the High Street, the investigation is ongoing.



Rublees Allotments

During the evening of the 01st October, Rublees allotments had several sheds broken into. Items were moved around the site and a metal detector was stolen. I have liaised with Shelley Marks Thomson who is the chair for the allotment association regarding security on the site, alongside the wardens I am arranging a date in the near future to offer crime prevention advice and property marking for the users of the allotments.

Cold callers

We have received reports of bogus callers that have been very convincing, company names such as AOL and SKY have been used to fraudulently gain bank details and other personal information. I have conducted home visits to several people who have unfortunately fallen victim to these crimes and I would like to remind the public to never give sensitive/ confidential or private information over the phone.
