

Monthly Report for Steyning Parish Council May 2013

Anti-Social Behaviour

Last month we mentioned some small groups of youths that we had concerns over; we have continued to monitor these groups wherever possible and are please to say we haven't encountered any further problems. However, we will still continue to monitor.

I'm sure many of you are already aware that we had a speight of graffiti which affected Goring Road, College Hill, Jarvis Lane and Fletchers Croft. We very quickly attended to remove as much graffiti as we could and patrolled the area extensively. We spoke to several residents in the area and worked closely with the neighbourhood policing team, passing on information of whom we believe to be responsible.

We received a few complaints in relation to anti social driving of two vehicles from shooting field. One of which is known to us, we have given words of warning and have not had any calls about the vehicle since. We would like to remind residents that they can log this type of issue via 'operation crackdown' on the internet, this aids police response and potential for enforcement.

We encountered and challenged two drunken people in Steyning on the Friday night of the Big Church Day Out. We informed the Neighbourhood policing team as one of the individuals was known to us. We didn't receive any calls of nuisance regarding these individuals, just one call from a resident about the noise from the event itself.

The fly tipping that was dumped on the side of Horsham Road has now been removed.
