Neighbourhood Wardens Report – August 2017

We received reports of Anti-Social Driving in the Fletchers Croft car park. The car was reported to be doing handbrake turns at speed & also performing doughnut's late at night. A description of the car was given but no vehicle registration number. We are monitoring the area of an evening in a bid to deter the behaviour or witness the behaviour to obtain further details. Please be aware if you do witness anti-social driving and do manage to obtain a vehicle registration, these can also be given to the Police via the operation crackdown website.

A resident contacted us regarding some ASB issues at Charlton Court, Mouse Lane. A group of young people in the area have been going into one of the barns and on one occasion had started up a tractor and left the engine running. We have since been visiting the area regularly in case of any repeat occurrences.

We have been told of an incident where several glass bottles had been smashed in the bus shelter in high street, allegedly a group of young people were playing football with bottles in the high street at 01:30am. We would like to remind and encourage residents who are witnessing any Behaviour of this nature to call it in to ourselves and the Police on 999 if necessary. To add to this, we have been doing leaflet drops across the three parishes relating to the importance of reporting Anti-Social Behaviour and Crime.

Whilst on a routine Patrol we were alerted to the presence of a rough sleeper in Kings Barn Lane, we saw the individual later that evening in the High Street Bus Shelter. The Police attended and checked his welfare, the individual stayed overnight and left the following morning.

We engaged with a group of Youths playing football on the school grounds at approximately 10:30PM, in recent months we had reports regarding late night noise nuisance from people using the area to play football. We spoke to the group and ensured they left the school grounds.

We were called to a property in Reeds Walk regarding a spate of Anti-social behaviour relating to an ongoing neighbour dispute. We have spoken to both parties and informed relevant partnership agencies including the Police & Saxon Weald with reference ongoing concerns relating to alleged ASB.

The reported Fly Tipping at the Bostal has now been removed.
