Neighbourhood Wardens Report November 2016

Anti-Social Behaviour and Crime

On the 6th November a garage door was broken in a premises in Mouse Lane and tools were stolen. A neighbour also reported that their vehicle had been broken into.

Sometime between 1830-1930 on 8th November a resident's bag was stolen from their premises in Shooting field. It is unknown how the thief gained entry.

Sometime between 2230 -10.00am on the 9th November an attempt to enter a Community building was made by the Fire Door. Nothing was stolen.

On November 23rd at around 5.00pm., whilst on patrol, I had to intervene when a male was causing a nuisance at the Dingemans Centre by buzzing residents and trying to gain access. He claimed he was trying to talk to a resident who no longer lived there. The male is known to us and has issues with his mental health especially when drinking alcohol. I persuaded him to leave and return to his home. I have logged the incident with the Police.

On the 25th November an attempt was made to enter a residents premises in Kings Barn Lane by breaking a backdoor window. Nothing was stolen.

On the same date a similar attempt was made at another premises in Kings Barn lane via a patio door, but access was not gained.

Police attended an incident in Steyping, High street when they were informed that a settling of scores had been arranged by youths from Steyping and Lancing. Weapons were confiscated and arrests made following assaults.

On Friday 25th November we intervened with a group of males causing a noise nuisance outside the Cricket Club on the memorial playing field. They were swearing and were abusive to us and drunk and disorderly. We logged the incident with the police and reported two males to the anti-social behaviour team as this is one of many occasions when their behaviour in public has not been acceptable.

On a Saturday 26th November at around midnight a resident in Steyping high street was assaulted when he refused to allow a drunk into his house who was demanding a place to stay for the night. Unfortunately the incident was not reported to the police but was posted on a social media site. We would like to encourage the victim to contact the police about the incident.

On the same evening and shortly after this incident a resident from Roman road was disturbed by someone banging loudly on their door.
