### Neighbourhood Wardens Report Nov 2015

#### Anti-Social Behaviour and Crime

A garage/workshop at a property in Castle Lane was broken into. The offender gained access by breaking a window. Nothing is believed to have been taken.

Sometime between Thursday 29 October and Thursday 5 November an unknown suspect gained entry to a property in Roman Road. Patio doors at the property were forced open and jewellery and a pillow case were taken.

At approximately 1:10pm on Tuesday 17 November a man with a silver coloured car was seen in Horsham Road, Steyning trying to flag down cars. One passer-by stopped and spoke with the man who stated that he had run out of petrol and didn't have any cash. He tried to exchange jewellery for money. This is a known scam as the jewellery offered is often of poor quality and not worth the value of cash it is exchanged for. Please be aware and do not hand over any money.

On a Monday 16<sup>th</sup> November in the afternoon at approximately 16.30 a young male threw a brick through the window of Burts Estate agents in Steyning High street. Police will be interviewing a suspect although at present his motives are unclear.

An outbuilding in Mouse Lane was broken into sometime between 12pm on Saturday 31 October and 11am on Friday 6 November. A yellow and white Suzuki RM250 motocross motorcycle was stolen along with a number of mountain bike tyres.

On Wednesday November 25<sup>th</sup>, after receiving information from a resident, a Police Officer issued a Fixed Penalty Notice of £90 to a young male adult in Fletchers Croft for possession of cannabis.

On Friday evening November 20<sup>th</sup> two males, one adult and the other under eighteen.(both are known to us) were riding on bicycles along Church Street when an altercation took place between them and a couple walking on the pavement. What appeared to be a homemade (Pepper) Spray was discharged. Members of the public detained a male adult until the Police arrived and he was arrested for assault.
